# Supporting wellbeing

With social isolation it is important that we look after all aspects of our health and wellbeing. #### **Domestic Abuse**

In our last update we included a link to support those who may be experiencing **domestic abuse**. The National Domestic Abuse service has seen a 25% rise in calls since lockdown measures were introduced to combat the coronavirus pandemic.

There is now an <u>additional link</u> to a help line that has been set up to support those within Hampshire.

A Hampshire charity, Aurora New Dawn, has set up a new domestic abuse helpline for victims after seeing an increase in calls across the country.

### Staff training

Now is a great opportunity to ensure teaching staff are up to date with their mandatory training (Prevent, Safeguarding and British Values).

We are still recommending the 'Prevent training' provided by Education Training Foundation (ETF). This is free training, you just need to set up a log in.

The safeguarding training 'safeguarding Everyone' is no longer available through HCC safeguarding board virtual learning college. You can still access this training direct through virtual learning college, however there is a small charge for this. As a

replacement we would suggest that tutors complete the <u>ETF course on</u> <u>safeguarding</u>. We are working with our workforce development team to enable ACL tutors to access other sources of safeguarding training and will update you as soon as we have details confirmed.

The British Values training is still available on the VLE. Tutors need to access the resources and go through the PowerPoint, then take the quiz. On successful completion they will be able to print off a certificate.

Please let us know if you have any other CPD needs.

#### Funding:

HCC is keen to continue to support ACL delivery. Your lead contact should have received an email from Christine Hansford this week in relation to funding. Please do contact her directly if you have any questions in relation to this.

**Online safety** is a big concern with learning especially for those who are delivering learning online. To help ensure this we have produced some guideline on e-safety, which were circulated by Sue earlier this week. These are also available on our <u>VLE</u>. Do make sure you tutors are fully versed on best practice on ensuring e-safety. You might want to suggest that they complete some e-safety training.
