HSCP offer a range of eLearning courses as part of the virtual offer. Teaching Pedagogy: Personalisation

Personalisation in education should enable us to develop environments and learning opportunities that mean that all learners, whatever their starting point, are able to fulfil their potential as learners. Personalisation involves creating a coherent learning environment where learners will experience the range of approaches and opportunities that will enable them to increase their competence as self-motivated learners. To achieve personalised learning, we need to ensure that initial assessment is used alongside systematic observation and assessment to identify specific barriers or challenges to learning.

Personalisation is not about creating individual experiences and a separate curriculum per every learner but is about ensuring that we include our knowledge of learners starting points, interests, characteristics to ensure the curriculum is accessible to all and all are able to make progress and achievement.

Personalisation is learner focused, with the learner being involved in setting their learning goals and may contribute to the design of the curriculum. Many of us are doing this already, without putting a name to it, such as adding content to suit learner need or interest.

Those of you with an interest in psychological approaches to education will see that this follows a humanistic approach (person centred).

Teaching Glossary: Deep dive



When inspectors evaluate the quality of education during an inspection, they carry out 'deep dives' in order to understand the setting's curriculum. This involves gathering evidence on the curriculum intent, implementation, and impact over a sample of curriculum subjects or following a theme/topic. As part of this deep dive, they will use a

wide range of evidence sources, including talking to leaders, tutors and learners, observing sessions, reviewing learner work. Through close inspection of several subjects/areas, the inspectorate says they can better judge the overall quality of the education we deliver.

Responding to Israel/Palestine conflict

The current situation may be very emotive for learners and staff alike. would expect all staff to remain politically impartial and to challenge any inappropriate comments or behaviours that learners or colleagues might make.
