#### Best Practice examples from recent observations:



**Initial Assessment:** Use of pre-course questionnaire to support initial assessment, which is then revisited at the end of the course to measure distant travelled.

**Embedding Maths:** using statistics and calculations to problem solve within an Awareness Day theme

## Teaching Pedagogy: What pedagogy do the best tutors use?

Pedagogy, from the Greek term 'paidagogia,' meaning, "office of a child's tutor" is defined by Dictionary.com as meaning, "The art or science of teaching; education; instructional methods." A definition of pedagogy as simple as the one stated above does not convey the complexities of the subject which has led educators and theorists to debate the subject of how people learn for hundreds of years.

In their 2012 paper, Chris Husbands and Jo Pearce explore 'Nine claims from research' into what makes the best pedagogy. The fact that there are nine strong effective pedagogies just emphasise the fact that this is a complex area for teachers.

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There is no 'one size fits all' solution to what makes an effective tutor. They conclude that, "classrooms are complex, multi-faceted and demanding places" and that the best tutors make, "active connections between the ideas from research." (Husbands & Pearce, 2012). It is up to tutors then to look at their learners and to decide what effective pedagogy means to them.

What makes great pedagogy? Nine claims from research (publishing.service.gov.uk)

One of the pedagogical approaches we use within Hampshire Achieves is Rosenshine's Principles of instruction. If you are a new tutor and don't know these principles, then sign up to one of our workshops on them. Over the next number of issues, we will be looking at some of the key elements to effective teaching.

## **Teaching Glossary: Enrichment**



**Enrichment** means doing something beyond the classroom or in addition to the main session that will enrich the learning. This could be encouraging learners to join a group to extend their use of new skills. A good example of this is the Ukelele club on Hayling Island held at the library which learners can join following their introductory course.

Within our longer courses it might be something such as fundraising or volunteering which practices organisation skills.

### **Digital tools: GeoGebra**



For tutors supporting maths check out GeoGebra.

GeoGebra is a dynamic mathematics software for all levels of education that brings together geometry, algebra, spreadsheets, graphing, statistics, and calculus in one engine.

### **Moving towards Outstanding**
