

Paul has noticed a number of Learner records that have a "Known as" name which is the same as the Forename.



To save you some time and unnecessary keystrokes, he'd like to point out that the Known as field can be left blank in cases where it would be the same as the Forename. The "Known as" field is used on the Registers. If it is blank then the Forename is used so if you don't need to use a different name on the registers to the learner's official forename, you can just leave it blank. If you are changing any learner records and notice that the Forename and "Known as" fields are the same, please clear the "Known as" field. If you have any questions about this, please ask Paul.

Best Practice examples from recent observations:

Thrives Art courses: when handing out paper have a positive phrase written on it or put on post-it notes.

Regulated courses: making clear links to assessment criteria, and how to demonstrate distinction behaviours.



Professional Knowledge and Understanding:

Critically review and apply your knowledge of educational research, pedagogy, and assessment to develop evidence-informed practice.

Teaching Pedagogy: Self-Determination Theory

The success of learning not only relies on tutor expert delivery but also learner motivation. If learners lack motivation, then successful outcomes are limited.

Self-determination theory suggests that there are three basic psychological needs that contribute to intrinsic motivation. By using these three elements we can help motivate learners.

- 1) Autonomy: learners need to feel that they have choice and control. Feelings of coercement or 'having to' result in motivation levels plummeting.
- 2) Competence: Learners need to feel that they can achieve, and the learning will be within their capability.
- 3) Relatedness: Lastly learners need to connect to the topic/subject, they also need to connect to others having a sense of belonging.

If these three elements are in place, then learners will have intrinsic rewards from attending their course and will be more likely to achieve and progress.

Teaching Glossary: Grapple

Grapple means to come to grips with. Within education this means allowing learners the opportunity to explore and investigate a theme, topic or concept, drawing their own conclusions. This idea links to the proverb "tell me and I forget, teach me and I remember, involve me and I learn" (Benjamin Franklin). By allowing learners the time to explore and delve into new material will enable a deeper level of understanding and move this new knowledge into the long-term memory.

Digital tools:

As some of you may know Google is closing its Jamboard app. From **1st October 2024** you'll no longer be able to create new or edit existing Jams on any platform with it being placed in 'view-only' mode between **1st October 2024** and **31st December 2024**. After **31st December 2024** it will no longer be accessible.

There are many different online whiteboards available to you to use and we have created a short guide on five of these (Miro, Microsoft Whiteboard, MURAL, Conceptboard and ShareTheBoard. Don't feel that you must use one of these, this is just an introduction to some of your options. Google themselves recommend Miro, Lucidspark & Figma but don't be afraid to try different online whiteboards to see what works best for you.
