Non Fiction - Monarch Butterfly

- Where do monarch butterflies spend the winter?
 Mexico
- 2. Why is it important for the monarch to fly back north to USA and Canada when it's spring?

For the milkweed/monarchs eat milkweed/No milkweed in Mexico/Lay their eggs.

- 3. 'Once the caterpillar hatches, it gorges...' What does it mean by 'gorges'? 'Gorge' means to eat greedily.
- 4. What makes the butterfly so 'incredible' and 'amazing'? Think of at least three Award three marks in total from:
 - · travels thousands of miles/migrates
 - · spends winter/hibernates in Mexico
 - · flies back north (to USA and Canada) in the spring
 - · migrates further than any other butterfly
 - takes four generations for the migration cycle to happen/ great grandchild will complete the journey
 - transformation into a butterfly (creates a chrysalis)
 - · their behaviour baffles scientists.

- 2. How many butterflies were in the colony?

 Over 100 million
- 3. 'For a moment, she lost sight of her best friend. "Mondo!" she cried out.' How do you think Meena was feeling at this point in the story?
 - Award one mark for: worried, anxious, concerned, nervous, alone, upset, sad (or similar).
 - Award one extra mark if suitable reason is provided, e.g. because she thought that she had lost Mondo.
- 4. At the end, it says the two butterflies 'drifted slowly away'. What do you think it means by this?
 - They died/feel into a deep sleep together.
