John Muir's Life

John Muir was born in Dunbar, Scotland in 1838. As a boy, he loved to go for walks and adventures. He moved to America when he was 11. He worked on his family's farm and loved to study, explore and invent things.

The home John lived in as a child is now a museum. It is also the start of John Muir Way, a long walk that takes 9-11 days to complete.

National parks help to conserve and protect wild places.

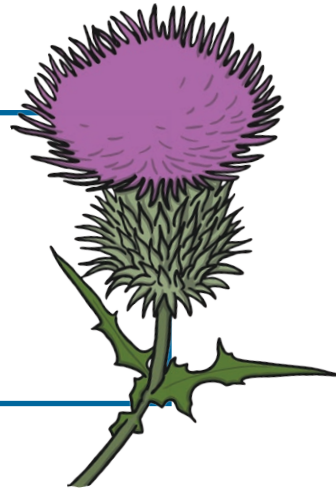
Who Was John Muir?

John Muir was one of the first conservationists. A conservationist is a person who protects natural places and living things. He enjoyed exploring the world around him and wrote books about his travels.

Early Life

John Muir was born in 1838, in Dunbar, Scotland. As a boy, he loved exploring wild places. When he was 11, John's family moved to America. John lived and worked on the family's farm for 10 years. He enjoyed studying, exploring and inventing things.

The house John was born in is now a museum. The museum marks the start of the John Muir Way. This is a 134-mile walk and takes 9-11 days to complete on foot



In 1867, after an accident at work that almost made him blind, John knew he wanted to explore the outdoors more than anything. When he recovered, the first thing he did was complete a 1000-mile walk!

John loved everything about nature; the insects, the wild animals, the plants, trees, rivers and mountains. His love of nature made him want to protect it. He started the national park system. National parks help to conserve and protect wild places. In 1890, Yosemite Valley in California became the first national park. The park is now visited by over 4 million people each year.
